A Bill to Set Fair Labor Standards for Tipped Wages

1	BE IT ENACT	ED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:
2	SECTION 1 .	The United States will amend Title 29 of the US Labor Code to
3		require that companies with tipped employees are paid minimum
4		wages.
5	SECTION 2 .	A tipped employee engages in an occupation in which he or she
6		customarily and regularly receives more than \$30 per month in tips.
7	SECTION 3.	The United States Department of Labor as well as the Internal
8		Revenue Service will be responsible with overseeing and enforcing
9		this legislation. Penalties may include but are not limited to:
10		A. A fine of 15% of the company's average annual income
11		B . Ineligibility for any tax credits
12	SECTION 4.	Once passed companies have six months to adhere before penalties
13		will be enforced.
14	SECTION 5.	This legislation will take effect on January 1 st , 2024. All laws in
15		conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

6	SECTION 3. The Federal Communications Commission shall oversee full enforcement
7	of the legislation.
8	SECTION 4. This legislation will take effect on January 1, 2024.
9	SECTION 5. All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

7		Failure to comply may result in:		
8		A. Penalties plus taxes owed.		
9		B . Jail time		
10	SECTION 4.	This legislation will be implemented on April 15, 2025.		
11	SECTION 5.	All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.
