Current Issue:

Public Forum (PF)

- Coin toss determines the organization of the round. Winner selects either pro/con OR speaking order. The remaining option of pro/con OR speaking order is chosen by the team which lost the coin toss.

Student Congress (CON)

- First negative speeches on each legislation followed by 2 minute questioning period.
- Alternating affirmative/negative speeches followed by 1 minute questioning periods
- Students may have nonelectronic visual aids
