A Bill to Restrict Internal Combustion Vehicles to Mitigate Environmental Damage

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THIS CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

2 SECTION 1. The United States shall ban the production, sale, purchase and/or

3 importation of internal-combustion private personal vehicles.

4 SECTION 2. Private personal vehicles will be defined as street legal vehicles produced

5 for non-commercial use by residents. Internal combustion shall be

6 defined as an engine that is directly reliant on a gas or diesel fuel to run.

7 SECTION 3. The Federal Trade Commission in cooperation with the U.S. Department

8 of Transportation Administrations, shall oversee the implementation of9 this legislation.

10 A. Individuals found in violation of this bill, will be fined the market

11 value of the vehicle.

- 12 B. Vehicle distributors and producers found in violation of this bill will
- 13 have all violating vehicles seized by the government, as well as a fine
- 14 of three times the market value of the vehicle per unit sold.

15 C. All fines collected shall be used toward interstate highway and bridge**16** repair.

17 SECTION 4. This bill shall be implemented on January 1, 2030.

18 SECTION 5. All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Resolution to Propose an International Treaty Banning Lethal Autonomous Weapons

WHEREAS, Lethal autonomous weapons are being developed by multiple countries; and
 WHEREAS, Lethal autonomous weapons operate using artificial intelligence without
 the need for human control; and
 WHEREAS, International rules and norms regarding the use of these weapons are
 currently insufficient to govern their use; and
 WHEREAS, The risk of miscalculation and accidents could lead to the loss of
 countless lives; now, therefore, be it
 RESOLVED, That the Congress here assembled shall propose to the United
 Nations an international treaty banning the use of lethal autonomous weapons.

A Bill to Ban Prescribed Fires

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THIS CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

2 SECTION 1. The United States Forest Service shall no longer conduct proceedings and

3 measures related to prescribed burning and adopt alternative fire

4 suppression and mitigation mechanisms instead.

5 SECTION 2. Prescribed burning shall be defined as the process of executing a controlled

6 burn under favorable weather conditions to reduce the probability of a larger

7 fires occurring.

8 SECTION 3. The United States Forest Service shall be tasked with the enforcement of this9 legislation.

10 SECTION 4. This legislation shall take effect immediately upon passage.

11 SECTION 5. All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Resolution to Protect National Security by Mandating At Least Fifty Percent of All Critical Industry is Produced Domestically

1 WHEREAS, Covid-19 proved that our national security is at risk when other countries
2 choose to cut off access to necessary goods for any reason; and
3 WHEREAS, American industry and livelihood is at risk when too much of it is
4 produced in foreign countries; and
5 WHEREAS, Intellectual property theft loses the American economy billions of dollars
6 a year; and
7 WHEREAS, Americans are at risk of potential nefarious actions when huge portions
8 of our critical industries are manufactured overseas; now, therefore, be it
9 RESOLVED, That the Congress here assembled make the following
10 recommendation for mandating at least fifty percent of all critical industry be
11 manufactured in the United States; and, be it
12 FURTHER RESOLVED, That American industry has ten years to move their manufacturing
13 base back to the United States to be within the fifty percent compliance threshold.

A Bill to Modernize U.S. Nuclear Power Plant Infrastructure

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

- 2 Section 1. The United States shall provide a federal research grant of \$50 billion to
- 3 the Department of Energy (DOE) towards research of modernized nuclear technologies
- 4 and radioactive waste solutions.
- **5** Section 2. Nuclear energy production shall be defined as the use of fission as a means
- 6 of producing heat in order to generate electricity. Nuclear power plants shall be defined
- 7 as the structures which facilitate the process mentioned above.
- 8 Section 3. The United States Nuclear Regulatory Commission and the Department of
- 9 Energy shall oversee the implementation of this legislation. Funding shall be provided by
- 10 a 2% income tax increase on those with an income of \$500,000 or more annually.
- **Section 4.** This legislation shall take effect on January 1st, 2024.
- **Section 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation shall be declared null and void.

A Bill to Phase-Out High Fructose Corn Syrup

- 1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:
- 2 SECTION 1. The United States shall stop production and importation of high fructose
- **3** corn syrup and shall prioritize production of alternatives such as stevia and agave.
- 4 SECTION 2. For the purpose of this act, high fructose corn syrup is defined as a
- **5** sweetener made from corn starch that is used in commercially produced
- **6** food and soft drinks as a cheaper alternative to sucrose.
- 7 SECTION 3. The U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA) and the Department of
- 8 Health and Human Services (DHHS) shall oversee the implementation of this legislation.
- **9** Any and all companies found violating this bill will be fined \$100,000 per offense.
- 10 This bill will be financed through increased income tax on food services (such as
- 11 restaurants), food processors (such as meat, dairy and frozen food processors), and
- 12 food retailers (such as grocery stores and farm producers).
- **SECTION 4.** This legislation shall go into effect at the start of 2027.
- **SECTION 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation will be declared null and void.

A Constitutional Amendment to Eliminate Corporate Political Contributions

1 **RESOLVED**, By two-thirds of the Student Congress here assembled, that the following 2 article is proposed as an amendment to the Constitution of the United States, which shall 3 be valid to all intents and purposes as part of the Constitution when ratified by the legislatures of three-fourths of the several states within seven years from the date of its 4 5 submission by the Congress: 6 **ARTICLE --**7 **SECTION 1**: Constitutional rights of natural born citizens do not extend to 8 organizations, including for-profit corporations and limited liability companies. This 9 exclusion applies to all organizations, whether foreign or national. 10 **SECTION 2**: Such organizational entities are expressly prohibited from offering, 11 raising, contributing, or making expenditures for, against or in any election of any 12 candidate running for public office. Such entities are additionally prohibited from making 13 expenditures in any public vote for a ballot measure. 14 **SECTION 3**: Congress shall have power to enforce this article by appropriate 15 legislation.

A Bill to Implement Desalination Plants in the U.S.

2 SECTION 1. The U.S. federal government shall hereby invest in desalination plants in3 coastal cities

4 SECTION 2. A. Desalination plants shall be defined as industrial facilities that use

5 chemical or physical processes to reduce or recover salt concentrations

6 from water supplies

7 B. Coastal cities shall be defined as cities located on the interface or

8 transition areas between land and sea, including large inland lakes with

9 access to saltwater.

10 SECTION 3. The Department of Interior (DOI) will be given \$5 billion to be

11 allotted to private and state entities for the construction of desalination

12 plants.

13 SECTION 4. This bill will go into place January 1st, 2024.

14 SECTION 5. All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Bill to Ban TikTok

- 1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:
- 2 Section 1. The United States shall require all Domain Name System (DNS) Servers
- 3 in US states and territories to implement a DNS Sinkhole to refute routing and translating
- 4 all web requests to any and all IP addresses associated with TikTok or its parent
- 5 company, ByteDance Ltd.
- 6 **Section 2**. Definitions:
- 7 Domain Name System Servers: Technology that translates URL or domain name
- 8 information into an IP address.
- 9 DNS Sinkhole: Technology that reroutes specific URLs and domain names to an
- 10 alternate page to prevent users from accessing specific sites.
- 11 Section 3. This legislation will be overseen in collaboration between the Department of
- 12 Justice (DOJ) and the Cybersecurity and Infrastructure Security Agency (CISA), with
- 13 additional oversight from the Enhanced Cybersecurity Services (ECS).
- 14 A. Funding for this legislation will come from the CISA annual budget.
- 15 B. All individuals or corporations possessing DNS servers in noncompliance with
- 16 the mandate will be fined \$10,000 per illegal request.
- 17 C. All revenue collected from the fine will increase the CISA budget.
- 18 **Section 4.** This legislation will be implemented on January 1st, 2024.
- 19 **Section 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Bill to Restrict Executive Branch Power over U.S. Trade Policy

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

- 2 **SECTION 1**. The Congress of The United States shall create a commission on trade to
- **3** be known as the "Congressional Commission on Trade" and hereinafter referred to as
- 4 the "Commission."
- **5** The Commission shall be composed of nine members of the House of Representatives
- **6** and nine members of the Senate, to be appointed under the rules of each house.
- 7 All actions made by the United States Representative for Trade or any other Executive
- 8 Branch action affecting foreign commerce shall be made in consultation with the
- **9** Commission and shall require the approval of the Commission.
- 10 SECTION 2. Foreign commerce shall be defined as commerce between any
- 11 entity within the United States and any entity outside of the United States.
- **SECTION 3.** The newly created Congressional Commission on Trade shall oversee the
- **13** implementation of this legislation.
- **SECTION 4.** This legislation shall take effect immediately upon passage.
- **SECTION 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are declared null and void.

A Bill to Limit Inquiries into Immigration Status

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT: 2 **SECTION 1.** The United States shall prohibit law enforcement from inquiring into the 3 immigration status of any individual that interacts with a government agency, unless 4 there are reasonable grounds to suspect the individual was convicted of a felony, was 5 deported from the United States, and is again present in the United States. 6 **SECTION 2**. Definitions: 7 Immigration Status: the way in which a person is present in the United States including. 8 but not limited to, United States citizenship, citizenship of any other country, legal right to 9 reside or otherwise be present in the United States, and the time or manner of a 10 person's entry into the United States. 11 Immigration status inquiries: asking for a Social Security number or other information 12 that would reveal an individual's immigration status. 13 **SECTION 3.** The United States Citizenship and Immigration Services (USCIS) in 14 cooperation with the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) will oversee the 15 implementation and enforcement of this legislation. 16 **SECTION 4.** This legislation will take effect immediately upon passage. 17 **SECTION 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.
