A Bill to Expand and Fund the WIC Program

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

1	SECTION 1.	The WIC (Women, Infants, and Children) program will be expanded by 4.3
2		billion dollars
3	SECTION 2.	For families making less than 120% of the national poverty rate, the
4		following baby products shall be provided for free: clothing, pacifiers, baby
5		bottles, formula and food, diapers, car seats, baby powder, baby wipes,
6		and baby lotion.
7	SECTION 3.	The Department of Health and Human Services will oversee
8		implementation of this legislation.
9	SECTION 4.	Funding will be diverted from the defense budget to pay for these family
10		necessities.
11	SECTION 5.	This legislation will take effect immediately after passing.
12	SECTION 6.	All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Bill To Implement A 60 day Waiting Period For All Firearm Purchases to Combat Increasing Gun Violence

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

1	SECTION 1.	Under the passage of this legislation, it will be mandatory to wait 60 days in
2		order for the merchant to run background checks and for the purchaser to
3		acquire training certification.
4	SECTION 2.	The ATF (Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearm and Explosives) will oversee
5		enforcement of this law.
6		A. Any person or merchant in violation will be fined 2,500 dollars (single
7		person) and 5,000 dollars (merchant) per violation.
8		B. Any persons in violation of this law five times will be imprisoned for a
9		minimum of 90 days.
10		C. Any merchants that have violated this law 3 times will be temporarily
11		shut down. After four violations, said merchant will be permanently
12		shut down.
13	SECTION 3.	This legislation will take effect on January 1, 2024.
14	SECTION 4.	All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Bill to Make Execution Illegal In The U.S.A.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

- 1 **SECTION 1**. A federal ban on all forms of execution shall be implemented.
- 2 **SECTION 2**. Execution refers to a sentence of death for a prisoner.
- 3 **SECTION 3.** The Department of Justice will oversee enforcement of this law
- 4 **SECTION 4**. Any extra expenses incurred by individual prisons or jails will be
- reimbursed by a federal reserve funded by a 1% increase in state income
 tax (\$14.08 billion).
- 7 **SECTION 5.** This bill will take effect on January 1, 2024.
- 8 **SECTION 6.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void. Introduced for Congressional Debate by Rocky Mountain Prep Rise.

A Bill to Implement A Maximum Age of Presidential Candidacy

- SECTION 1. Any person that would be over the age of 65 on the day of presidential
 election, shall not be allowed to apply for presidential candidacy.
- 4 **SECTION 2**. The FEC will be responsible for enforcement of this law.
- 5 SECTION 3. Any person found to have attempted a violation of this law shall serve no
 6 more than 15 years and no less less than 7 years in federal prison
- 7 **SECTION 4.** This legislation will take effect on January 1. 2024.
- 8 **SECTION 5.** All laws in conflict with this Bill are hereby declared null and void. *Introduced for Congressional Debate by Rocky Mountain Prep Rise.*

A Bill to Perform Monthly Examination In Foster Homes to Reduce Foster Care Abuse

4		examinations to ensure children are well-cared for both physically and mentally.	
5	SECTION 2 .	Foster care is a temporary service provided by States for children who cannot liv	
6		with their families.	
7	SECTION 3.	The Department of Health and Human Services will create standards and overse	
8		the implementation of this legislation.	
9	SECTION 4.	Implementation will be provided by a 1% income tax increase on citizens whose	
10		income exceeds \$100,000 yearly.	
11	SECTION 5.	This legislation will take effect on January 1, 2025.	
12	SECTION 6.	All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.	

A Resolution To Implement Universal Health Care

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

1	WHEREAS,	Many Americans are in massive debt due to health care expenses;

4	WHEREAS,	The U.S. as a whole has 195 billion dollars in medical debt, with the	
5		average American citizen owing 2,424 dollars in medical debt	
6		according to the most recent data available; and	
7	WHEREAS,	The American Government has a moral obligation to provide	
8		universal health care to its citizens, in order to decrease medical	
9		debt; now, therefore, be it	
10	RESOLVED,	That the Congress here assembled advocates a Federally supported	
11		and mandated universal health care plan for every citizen.
