2023 Concord Speech Meet Congress Legislation

A Resolution to Amend the Constitution to Establish Term Limits for the Supreme Court

- 1. **RESOLVED**, By two-thirds of the Congress here assembled that the following article is proposed as an
- 2. amendment to the Constitution of the United States, which shall be valid to all intents and purposes as
- 3. part of the Constitution when ratified by the legislatures of three-fourths of the several states within
- 4. seven years from the date of its submission by the Congress:
- 5. ARTICLE --
- 6. **SECTION 1.** Justices of the Supreme Court of the United States shall now be limited to 18 years of7. service.
- 8. **SECTION 2.** The 18-year limit for which sitting justices can serve shall start upon the ratification of this legislation.
- 10. **SECTION 3.** New justices shall be appointed using the methods outlined in Article 3 of the UnitedStates Constitution.
- 12. **SECTION 4.** Congress shall have the power to enforce this article by appropriate legislation.

A Bill to Permit Death Row Inmates to Donate Their Organs to Compatible Recipients

- 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THIS UIL CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:
- 2. SECTION 1. Death row inmates will be permitted to apply for organ donorship. Inmate applicants will
- 3. be evaluated based on health standards and must be deemed eligible by these standards.
- 4. SECTION 2. A death row inmate will be defined as someone who is sentenced to death by lethal
- 5. injection or other means.
- 6. SECTION 3. The Federal Bureau of Prisons will oversee and create the application process for organ
- 7. donation. The Correctional Managed Health Care System will establish and enforce
- 8. donor inmate health standards. They will also be responsible for inmate health
- 9. evaluations.
- 10. SECTION 4. This bill will go in effect September 2025, to allow for applications and health care
- 11. standards to be created.
- 12. SECTION 5. All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Bill to End the Cuban Embargo to Promote Foreign Relations with the Republic of Cuba

- 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:
- 2. **SECTION 1.** The United States of America will repeal all sanctions pertaining to the Republic of Cuba
- 3. except arms trade and nuclear power. Furthermore, The United States will stop all
- 4. military action aimed at hindering trade between the Cuban Republic and the rest of the
- 5. world.
- 6. **SECTION 2.** Sanctions shall be defined as an action, legislation, or regulation taken by the United
- 7. States government in order to discourage trade with the Republic of Cuba. Military action
- 8. shall be defined as planned or otherwise military exercises or the funding of rebellious
- 9. organizations, terror groups, and opposition candidates, parties, or organizations on
- 10. Cuban soil.
- 11. **SECTION 3.** The State Department in collaboration with the Treasury Department shall be tasked with
- 12. implementing this bill.
- 13. **SECTION 4.** This bill will go into effect on January 1, 2025.
- 14. **SECTION 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Bill to Decriminalize Drug Charges Relating to Possession

- 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:
- 2. SECTION 1. This bill will decriminalize drug use relating to possession of a controlled substance. This
- 3. bill will also establish a delegation of experts in the fields of healthcare and
- 4. pharmaceuticals to create a benchmark that assesses the amount of drug commonly
- 5. possessed by an individual for any medicinal, recreational, or therapeutic reasons. This
- 6. will also expunge any Federal conviction of possession of a controlled substance in an
- 7. amount equal to or less than the benchmark established by the delegation.
- 8. SECTION 2. A person in possession of or using a controlled substance with an amount that is no
- 9. greater than the amount determined by the delegation established in Section 1 shall not be
- 10. subject to criminal penalty.
- 11. SECTION 3. The Secretary of Health and Human Services shall establish the delegation. Each prior
- 12. Federal Conviction on drug possession and use will be expunged by each Federal court in
- 13. the district where the conviction occurred.
- 14. SECTION 4. This bill will be enacted by June 1, 2024.
- 15. SECTION 5. All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void
