#### JUDGE INFORMATION

#### ALL JUDGES MUST ATTEND THE JUDGE MEETING IN THE JUDGES LOUNGE AT 8:30 A.M. CST.

The tournament will utilize electronic judge ballots; judges should bring technology (preferably a laptop or chromebook *and* its charging device) in order to judge rounds. Judges should hit the "Start" button in Speechwire upon arrival to their round. Once this happens, they will be able to see which students have double-entered, and tournament staff will know that the round is in progress. Students are NOT to be penalized for arriving late to a round.

At the scheduled start of the round, please begin even if you are missing students (with the exception of Discussion). Many students are double or even triple entered and may not be present at the beginning of your round. Judges may change the speaking order on the ballot to accommodate double-entered students - please make sure your appropriate ranks go to the appropriate speaker. Please check your ranks for accuracy and submit your ranks as soon as possible to keep our tournament running smoothly. Ballots may be edited until a half hour after the final round is done.

Judges <u>must</u> remain available for final rounds until all final rounds have successfully started. Release prior to finals starting must be cleared by tournament staff.

In Extemp. Reading, there is no "qualifying time." Please do not penalize students if they do not speak for the full seven minutes.

#### **DRAW/PREP ROOMS**

Extemp. Reading Draw/Prep: Learning Commons (Library)

Extemp. Speaking Draw/Prep: Upper Commons (Upstairs overlooking the cafeteria)

Storytelling Draw/Prep: Lecture Room C201

All draw competitors should be in their assigned prep room at 8:15 AM for the draw meeting. First draw will take place promptly at 8:30 AM. In addition, entries must be in the prep/draw room at their assigned draw time for draws to be made available to them on Speechwire, and are expected to remain in the draw room until released by their draw supervisor. <u>Draw times will not be adjusted to accommodate double entries.</u> Speakers are expected to change order in non-draw events in order to accommodate their published draw time.

#### **AWARDS INFORMATION**

Awards will take place in the TBD as soon as possible after completion of all final rounds.

### **Advancement Protocol**

Final and Honor (Next-in) Final rounds will be held in all events. In events with 40 or more entries, an additional merit final round will be held. In events with 55 or more entries, both merit and consolation final rounds will be held.

No preliminary round section will feature more than seven entries, but we will work to maintain six entries or fewer as much as possible. The goal size of each final round is 6. Preliminary round results order will be determined by (1) Total Adjusted Rank (adjusted to a 5), (2) Head to Head competition, (3) Average Opponent Rank, and (4) Reciprocals. Speaker points will not be recorded or used in any round.

The Final Round of each event will have a panel of at least three judges. All Honor Final, Merit, and Consolation Rounds in both divisions will have one judge.

Final tournament placement will be decided on (1) Actual Ranks in the Final Round, (2) Judge Preference, (3) Reciprocals in the Final Round. If entries are still tied following these tiebreakers, preliminary round seed will be used to determine placement.

Discussants, please refrain from using ChatGPT or similar services.

### **Equity Procedures**






