6		the Treasury shall be tasked with the implementation of this legislation.
7	SECTION 4.	This legislation will go into effect immediately upon passage.
8	SECTION 5.	All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

3		technology companies by 50% for each stipulation unmet by the end of	
4		the fiscal year 2024.	
5		A. STIPULATION A: Implement ethical guidelines for the development	
6		and deployment of Artificial Intelligence (AI) to ensure fairness,	
7		transparency, and accountability.	
8		B. STIPULATION B: Establish mechanisms for users to have greater	
9		control over their data and understand how it is utilized in Al systems.	
10		C. All redirected funds will support research and initiatives promoting	
11		ethical AI development, if both stipulations are unmet by technology	
12		companies. If technology companies meet only one stipulation, 50%	
13		of funding will be cut.	
14	SECTION 2.	Technology companies, for the purpose of this legislation, will be defined	
15		as those with an annual revenue exceeding \$1 Billion.	
16	SECTION 3.	The Federal Trade Commission (FTC) will be responsible for oversight and	
17		enforcement of this legislation.	
18	SECTION 4.	This legislation will take effect June 1, 2024. All laws in conflict with this

A Bill to Place a Tax on Fast Fashion to Counteract Unethical Labor and Climate Change

5	SECTION 3.	The Internal Revenue Service (IRS) will oversee enforcement of this
6	. **	legislation as well as identify the corporations that qualify as fast fashion.
7		A. The money collected by this tax shall be used to fund better waste
8		collection and recycling systems.
9	SECTION 4.	This legislation will take effect on January 1, 2024. All laws in conflict with
10		this legislation are hereby declared null and void.
