

## **A Bill to Set a Price Cap on Necessary Medical Supplies**

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

- 1 **SECTION 1.** All medical companies must set a price cap on necessary individual medical  
2 supplies for no more than 100 dollars to make it more affordable for  
3 impoverished and struggling Americans
- 4 **SECTION 2.** The term “medically necessary” is defined as supplies that are deemed  
5 essential for treatment, and care of a medical condition such as;  
6 A. Asthma, type one and two diabetes, severe allergies, and other life  
7 threatening conditions.
- 8 **SECTION 3.** The Health and Human Services (HHS) will oversee enforcement of this bill  
9 A. If caught in violation of this act companies will be fined \$5,000 and will  
10 double for each subsequent violations
- 11 **SECTION 4.** This legislation will take effect on February 1 2027. All laws in conflict with  
12 this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

**FURTHER RESOLVED,** That the United States end all joint military exercise with India until a fair and equitable referendum for independence is held in Kashmir.

# **A Bill to Restrict Videos about dieting, body image, and beauty**

1                   **SECTION 1.** A. All videos whose primary content are about dieting, body  
2 image, or beauty will be restricted from view to individuals under 18.

3                                   B. Social media companies will be tasked with defining the  
4 videos that fall into these categories and implementing age restrictions.

5                   **SECTION 2.** A. The Federal Communications Commission  
6 will be responsible for the administration of this bill.

7                                   B. The FCC will also be tasked with the discretion of ensuring  
8 the definitions put forward by my social media companies are accurate.

9                   **SECTION 3.** A. Any and all media platforms who fail to comply will be  
10 charged with a 1 million dollar fee

11                                   B. The fine collected will Provide federal funding for  
12 organizations treating eating disorders.

13                   **SECTION 4.** This legislation will be enforced by the IRS and take effect  
14 on January 1st 2025. All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby  
15 declared null and void.
