**A Bill to Require Military Training for Coming-of-Age Youth**

1     **BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:**

2     **Section 1:** The United States shall require all able-bodied young adults to complete a  
3     year of military training that includes self-defense, the use of weapons, gun safety, and  
4     the value of human life. They must also pass the Basic Training Physical Fitness test.

5     **Section 2:** Definitions:

6     A.     Able-bodied: Physically healthy, fit, and strong. Exemptions determined by  
7     military medical test.

8     B.     Young adult: Anyone ages 17-22.

9     C.     Basic training physical fitness test: A test for boot camps that tests the camper's  
10    physical strength. For men ages 17 to 21, that means performing at least 35 push-ups  
11    and 47 sit-ups, as well as running two miles in no more than 16 minutes and 36  
12    seconds. Women recruits ages 17 to 21 must be able to do 13 push-ups and 47 sit-ups  
13    and post a time of no more than 19 minutes and 42 seconds on the two-mile run.

14    **Section 3:** The Defense Department will provide funding and oversight. Participants will  
15    receive housing, clothing, food, and \$5000 recompense.

16    **Section 4:** This bill will take effect January 1, 2027.

17    **Section 5:** All laws in conflict with this legislation shall be declared null and void.

**A Resolution to Move Towards Efficient and Electric Public Transportation**

1       **WHEREAS**, Transportation remains one of the highest contributors to greenhouse gas  
2       emissions throughout the United States; and  
3       **WHEREAS**, Only around 3% of all commuter, municipal, and trolley buses were  
4       zero-emission or all-electric as of 2023; and  
5       **WHEREAS**, Greenhouse gas emissions cause a multitude of adverse effects including  
6       health risks; and  
7       **WHEREAS**, 28 million people rely solely on public transportation as their means of  
8       commuting to work and school; now, therefore, be it  
9       **RESOLVED**, That the Congress here assembled move towards a zero-emission public  
10      transport system by 2030; and, be it  
11      **FURTHER RESOLVED**, That public transport be expanded to reduce issues of 12  
12      overcrowding, unexpected delays, and insufficient coverage of cities.

**A Bill to Institute Education Systems into Prisons**

1        **BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:**

2        **SECTION 1.** Federal prisons shall be required to provide a system of year-round  
3        education for inmates.

4        **SECTION 2.** Definitions

5        A. Education: Includes but is not limited to secondary and post-secondary education.

6        B. Prisons: Federally funded, brick and mortar, legal confinement centers both  
7        short-term and long-term. Does not include house arrest or short-term police custody.

8        **SECTION 3.** Both the Department of Justice and the Department of Education will  
9        oversee this law and enforce adherence to this law. The Department of Justice-  
10       specifically the Federal Bureau of Prisons- and the Department of Education will decide  
11       how the classrooms should be run and what the curriculum should be.

12       **SECTION 4.** Classrooms will be set up, teachers will be hired, and supplies will be  
13       purchased starting at the approval of this bill and no later than January 1st, 2026.

14       **SECTION 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

1       **WHEREAS**, Russia's recent actions have been dangerous and inappropriate; and  
2       **WHEREAS**, Russia is impeding global peace and security; and  
3       **WHEREAS**, Russia is blocking key work on the Security Council; and  
4       **WHEREAS**, Member nations can vote to suspend nations from the UN under article  
5       18; now therefore be it  
6       **RESOLVED**, By the congress here assembled that the United States shall urge other  
7       UN Member nations to use Article 18 to suspend Russia from the Security Council; and  
8       be it  
9       **FURTHER RESOLVED**, That the United States will suspend the 20% of the UN budget  
10      that is voluntarily contributed if this action is not taken by 2025.

7       intelligence has access to for reference should be limited only to works where the  
8       creator has given explicit permission.

**A Bill to Research Plastivores**

**1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:**

**2 SECTION 1.** The United States shall allocate funding for researching plastivores for the  
**3** purpose of controlling plastics in wastelands and waterways.

**4 SECTION 2.** Definitions

**5** A. Allocate: To apportion for a specific purpose.

**6** B. Funding: The action or practice of providing money.

**7** C. Research: Creative and systematic work undertaken to increase knowledge.

**8** D. Plastivores: Small organisms that consume plastic.

**9** E. Controlling: Limit the level, intensity, or numbers of a specific item.

**10** F. Plastic: A synthetic material made from a wide range of organic polymers.

**11** G. Wastelands: a place to dispose of refuse and other waste material by burying it  
**12** and covering it over with soil.

**13** H. Waterways: A river, canal, sea, or other route for travel by water.

**14 SECTION 3.** The National Science Foundation shall fund this legislation.

**15 SECTION 4.** This legislation will take effect in the fiscal year of 2026.

**16 SECTION 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

**A Resolution to Amend the Constitution to Change the Legal Voting Age**

1        **BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:**

2        **RESOLVED**, By two-thirds of the Congress here assembled, that the following article is  
3        proposed as an amendment to the Constitution of the United States, which shall be valid  
4        to all intents and purposes as part of the Constitution when ratified by the legislatures of  
5        three-fourths of the several states within seven years from the date of its submission by  
6        the Congress:

7        **ARTICLE --**

8        **SECTION 1:** The right of citizens of the United States, who are sixteen years of age or  
9        older, to vote shall not be denied or abridged by the United States or by any State on  
10       account of age.

11       **SECTION 2:** The Congress shall have power to enforce this article by appropriate  
12       legislation.

**A Resolution to Mandate Fair Market Value of Solar Panel Production**

1 **BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:**

2 **SECTION 1.** The United States shall mandate that electric utility companies must  
3 reimburse customers a fair market value when customers' solar panels produce an  
4 excess that goes to the grid.

5 **SECTION 2.** Definitions

6 A. Mandate: an official order or commission to do something.

7 B. Electric Utility Companies: A corporation, person, agency, authority, or other legal  
8 entity or instrumentality aligned with distribution facilities for delivery of electric energy  
9 for use primarily by the public.

10 C. Reimburse: Repay

11 D. Customers: A person with whom a company does business.

12 E. Fair Market Value: the price a business, property or other asset would sell for in  
13 an open and competitive market where the buyer and seller have adequate information  
14 of relevant facts, a reasonable time to complete a deal, are under no compulsion, are  
15 acting in their own interests and mutually agree on the price.

16 F. Solar Panels Production: electricity, a form of energy resulting from the existence  
17 of charged particles.

18 G. Excess: an amount of electricity that is more than necessary to meet the  
19 homeowners' electrical needs.

20 H. Grid: an interconnected network for electricity delivery from producers to  
21 consumers.

22 **SECTION 3.** The U.S. Federal Energy Regulatory Commission (FERC) shall oversee  
23 the implementation of this legislation.

24 **SECTION 4.** This legislation will take effect the fiscal year of 2026.

25 **SECTION 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

**A Bill to Reduce Light Pollution**

**1 BE IT ENACTED BY THIS CONGRESS THAT:**

**2 SECTION 1.** All buildings in the United States shall require all buildings to shield light  
**3** downward.

**4** A. All buildings in the United States will be required to have lights with a kelvin rating of  
**5** 3000 K or less.

**6** B. Buildings that require non-complying lights for navigation, safety, or construction  
**7** purposes will be exempt from the provisions of this bill.

**8 SECTION 2.** Definitions

**9** A. Kelvin ratings will be defined as a measure of temperature as defined by the  
**10** International System of Units (SI).

**11** B. Shielded down will be defined as having a cap or barrier above the light that  
**12** blocks light from going into the sky.

**13 SECTION 3.** This bill will be enforced by the Environmental Protection Agency. All  
**14** non-complying individuals or entities will be fined \$25 for the first offense per  
**15** non-compliant light fixture and \$50 per light fixture for future offenses.

**16 SECTION 4.** This legislation will take effect January 1st, 2028.

**17 SECTION 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

**A Resolution to Amend the Constitution to Properly Define a Well-Regulated Militia**

1 **BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:**

2 **RESOLVED,** By two-thirds of the Congress here assembled, that the following article is  
3 proposed as an amendment to the Constitution of the United States, which shall be valid  
4 to all intents and purposes as part of the Constitution when ratified by the legislatures of  
5 three-fourths of the several states within seven years from the date of its submission by  
6 the Congress:

7 **Second Amendment**

8 **SECTION 1:** A well-regulated Militia, being necessary to the security of a free State,  
9 the right of the people who are capable of serving or who have served in the Armed  
10 Forces to keep and bear Arms, shall not be infringed.

**2 SECTION 1.** The United States shall repeal the War on Terror Authorization for the Use  
**3** of Military Force.

**4 SECTION 2.** The War on Terror Authorization for the Use of Military Force is defined as  
**5** public law 107-40.

**6 SECTION 3.** The Secretary of State shall enforce this Act.

**7 SECTION 4.** This legislation shall take effect immediately upon passage.

**8 SECTION 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are declared null and void.

**A Bill to Enact Universal Basic Healthcare Automatic Coverage**

1     **BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:**

2     **SECTION 1.** The United States shall institute a universal basic healthcare system with  
3     no-cost coverage in regard to treatments and/or prevention on the most basic of levels to  
4     immediate necessary treatment and/or prevention for advanced conditions.

5     **SECTION 2.** The United States Department of Health and Human Services shall  
6     oversee and enforce this legislation.

7     A. The funding of this bill will be rooted in its origins of diverting excessive military funds,  
8     which number at billions of dollars or more.

9     B. In the situation where the above method is not adequate for this bill to function,  
10    the United States shall strictly enforce a 35% tax on individuals whose net worth reaches  
11    upwards of \$1 billion.

12    **SECTION 3.** This legislation will be effective immediately starting January 1st, 2026,  
13    after the logistics of funding have been placed.

14    **SECTION 4.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.
