**A Resolution to Secure American Oil**

1. **WHEREAS**, In 2022, the United States imported over 8.3 million barrels of petroleum
2. per day from 80 foreign countries; and
3. **WHEREAS**, In 2022, the United States exported over 9.5 million barrels of petroleum
4. per day to 180 foreign countries; and
5. **WHEREAS**, In 2022, the United States imported oil from adversarial states such as
6. Russia and Iraq; and
7. **WHEREAS**, Our reliance on foreign oil for domestic energy poses an immense
8. national security risk; now, therefore, be it
9. **RESOLVED**, That the Congress here assembled bans any private organization,
10. producer, or purveyor of oil from exporting petroleum to foreign countries; and, be
11. it
12. **FURTHER RESOLVED**, That the Congress here assembled bans any private
13. private organization, producer or purveyor of oil from importing petroleum from
14. foreign countries; and, be it
15. **FURTHER RESOLVED**, That any private organization, producer or purveyor of oil
16. found in violation of this resolution have their organizing, production, or
17. purveying rights revoked, and be tried for treason against the United States.

**The Compassionate Housing Act of 2025**

**1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:**

**2 SECTION 1.** Commercial buildings in states of long-term disuse or abandonment shall  
**3** be requisitioned by the federal government. Once acquired, these buildings shall be  
**4** converted into free housing for those in need.

**5 SECTION 2.** “Commercial buildings” shall be defined as any privately-owned location  
**6** built for commercial leasing purposes, including office buildings, strip malls, or malls.  
**7** “Long-term disuse” shall be defined as rentable properties having leasing rates which  
**8** fall consistently below 10% of units for a given fiscal year.

**9 SECTION 3.** The Department of Housing and Urban Development shall offer  
**10** payments to the owners of said unused buildings in exchange for the requisitioning  
**11** of their properties. If property owners reject the terms of purchase, the buildings may  
**12** be seized under eminent domain if deemed necessary.

**13 SECTION 4.** This legislation will take effect on June 1, 2025.

**14 SECTION 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby null and void.

**A Resolution to Affirm the Right to Protest on College Campuses**

1. **WHEREAS**, Students are a primary source of income for their universities; an
2. **WHEREAS**, This reality should make universities very sensitive to students' political
3. and ethical concerns; and
4. **WHEREAS**, Rhetoric around college protesters has become increasingly vitriolic and
5. is consequently serving to marginalize and suppress the voices of these students
6. who seek to exercise their democratic rights; now, therefore be it
7. **RESOLVED**, by the Congress here assembled that college students who choose to
8. engage in peaceful protest to express their political perspectives are celebrated
9. for doing so; and, be it
10. **FURTHER RESOLVED**, that Congress calls upon universities to refrain from
11. discouraging or disbanding peaceful protests, lest our nation's most prized
12. values be compromised.

3. **SECTION 2.** Congress instructs the leadership of the Secret Service to reassess the
4. agency's expenditures and procedures to ensure they can keep the nation's leaders
5. safe without wasteful spending or complacency.
6. **SECTION 3.** This legislation shall be enforced by the Dept. of Homeland Security.
7. **SECTION 4.** This legislation shall take effect on January 1st, 2025.
8. **SECTION 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

5. Mexico with the purpose of Mexico eventually requesting to join NATO.
6.     A.. The US will start training Mexican Armed Forces inside of Mexico.
7.     B. Mexico shall be given modernized military equipment to replace outdated
8.     variants.
9. **SECTION 3.** The US Department of State and Department of Defense will be
10. responsible for the implementation of this legislation.
11. **SECTION 4.** This legislation will take effect on January 1, 2025. All laws in conflict
12. with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

**A Bill to Hold Social Media Companies Liable for Scams**

**1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:**

**2 SECTION 1.** Social media companies shall henceforth be held liable for the financial  
**3** harm caused by scamming that occurs on their platform. When such scamming  
**4** occurs, a social media company shall be required to reimburse the victimized user for  
**5** any financial losses resulting from the scam.

**6 SECTION 2.** Any social media company found to be in violation of this legislation shall  
**7** be fined double the amount they ought to have reimbursed, with half of that fine to be  
**8** given over to the affected user and the other half retained to finance enforcement.

**9 SECTION 3.** This legislation shall be jointly overseen by the Federal Communications  
**10** Commission (FCC) and the Department of Justice (DOJ).

**11 SECTION 4.** This legislation shall take effect on January 1, 2025.

**12 SECTION 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby null and void.
