A Bill to Ban Political Action Committees

1 **BE IT ENACTED BY THIS CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:**

2 **SECTION 1.** Political Action Committees (PACs) currently improperly influence
3 elections. Banning PACs will ensure that the voice of the common person is not
4 infiltrated by people who do not represent their interests.

5 **SECTION 2.** A Political Action committee is defined as a tax-exempt organization that
6 pulls campaign donations from members and donates those funds to campaigns,
7 ballot initiatives, or legislation.

8 **SECTION 3.** The Federal Election Commission will monitor compliance:

9 A. Candidates found to be using PAC money will face 10 years of prison time and
10 be barred from future federal elections.

11 B. Contributions from PACs that have violated this law will be seized and reallocated
12 to the Federal Election Commission budget.

13 **SECTION 4.** This legislation will go into effect January 1, 2026.

14 **SECTION 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are declared null and void.

**A Bill to Repeal All Economic Sanctions on Venezuela to
Combat Poverty and Humanitarian Issues**

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

2 SECTION 1. The United States shall repeal and end all economic sanctions placed on
3 Venezuela, Venezuelan officials, or Venezuelan private citizens.

4 SECTION 2. Economic sanctions shall be defined as commercial and financial
5 penalties applied against other states or individuals.

6 SECTION 3. The US Department of the Treasury shall be responsible for the
7 implementation and enforcement of this legislation.

8 SECTION 4. This legislation shall be implemented by January 1, 2026.

9 SECTION 5. All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Resolution to Prohibit Private Space Exploration

4 **WHEREAS**, This has delayed Earth's potential for space exploration and discovery,

5 drastically reducing humanity's future prospects; and

6 **WHEREAS**, International cooperation pertaining to space exploration may result in

7 more diplomacy and collaboration between Earth's countries; now, therefore, be it

8 **RESOLVED**, That the Congress here assembled petition Earth's countries to pursue a

9 worldwide treaty banning private space exploration.

**A Bill to Require Federally Elected Officials to be Cleared of any
Legal Proceedings Before Taking Office**

1 **BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:**

2 **SECTION 1.** Federally elected officials shall resolve any/all legal proceedings they are
3 involved with before they are sworn into office.

4 **SECTION 2.** A. Federally Elected officials shall be defined as individuals who have
5 been chosen through a voting process to hold a federal-level public office.

6 B. Legal Proceedings shall be defined as the act of using a lawyer or a court to help
7 a disagreement.

8 **SECTION 3.** The United States Federal Judiciary will oversee the implementation of
9 this bill. Any federally elected official who is not cleared of legal proceedings within 60
10 days of swearing in forfeits the elected position.

11 **SECTION 4.** This bill will go into immediate effect upon passage.

12 **SECTION 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby null and void.

A Bill to Withdraw Tactical Nuclear Weapons from Europe

1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

2 SECTION 1. The Department of Defense will remove all tactical nuclear weapons
3 from Europe to U.S. military bases inside the U.S. or its Territories.

4 SECTION 2. Tactical nuclear weapons shall be defined as nonstrategic nuclear
5 weapons that have a yield of a fraction of kiloton to 50 kilotons and can be deployed in
6 multiple formats from short range missiles to gravity bombs to surface to air missiles
7 or torpedoes.

8 SECTION 3. The Department of Defense will move the weapons to bases that would
9 allow them to be repurposed for the defense of the United States and its allies. The
10 weapons themselves can then be:

11 A. Updated technologically and placed in the United States territories or on
12 naval ships or submarines.

13 B. Disposed of by securing the nuclear material and storing in an
14 appropriate method for fissionable material.

15 SECTION 4. This legislation will take effect January 1, 2026.

16 SECTION 5. All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby null and void.

A Bill to Regulate U.S. Agricultural Lands for National Security

1 **BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:**

2 **SECTION 1.** The bill will prevent the sale or acquisition of U.S. private agricultural
3 land to individuals or groups considered foreign.

4 **SECTION 2.** Foreign will be defined as *not of the United States or its territories*,
5 including those who may have established U.S. residency but are not citizens of the
6 United States.

7 **SECTION 3.** The U.S. Treasury Department and the Department of the Interior will
8 oversee the enforcement of the bill. The U.S. Committee on Foreign Investment will
9 monitor land sales as significant concerns involving foreign buyers, specifically those
10 near U.S. military bases, or pose potential national security risks.

11 **SECTION 4.** The bill will take effect immediately upon passage.

12 **SECTION 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby null and void.
