A Bill to Fund High-Speed Rail Development

1	BE IT ENACT	TED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:
2	SECTION 1.	The Department of Transportation shall allocate \$100 billion of
3		funding for the construction and implementation of high-speed rail
4		systems across the United States.
5	SECTION 2.	A High-Speed Rail System is defined as a rail network capable of
6		sustained speeds exceeding 150 miles per hour.
7	SECTION 3.	The Department of Transportation shall work in collaboration with
8		state and local authorities to identify and prioritize high-speed rail
9		corridors based on factors such as population density,
10		transportation demand, and potential economic impact.
11		Funding will come from the Department of Defense budget.
12	SECTION 4.	This legislation will take effect on January 1, 2025. All laws in
13		conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

The Free Union Act

1	BE IT ENACT	TED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:
2	SECTION 1.	The National Labor Relations Act will be amended to establish an
3		efficient system to enable employees to form, join, or assist labor
4		organizations, to provide for mandatory injunctions for unfair labor
5		practices during organizing efforts, and for other purposes.
6	SECTION 2.	Any labor union that collects signatures from a majority of the
7		workers at any given private enterprise shall be recognized by the
8		enterprise in question and the federal government without the need
9		for a separate vote. Employers and unions must enter collective
10		bargaining agreements within 120 days of union recognition.
11	SECTION 3.	A labor union shall be defined as an organized association of
12		workers, often in a trade or profession, formed to protect and
13		further their rights and interests. A college bargaining agreement
14		shall be defined as a written contract negotiated through collective
15		bargaining for the employees of a firm by one or more trade
16		unions.
17	SECTION 4.	The National Labor Relations Board and the Department of Labor
18		shall oversee the enforcement of the bill.
19	SECTION 5.	This legislation will take effect on January 1st, 2025.
20		All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null
21		and void.

A Bill to Aid the Central American Northern Triangle

1	BE IT ENACT	TED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:
2	WHEREAS,	The United States shall allocate \$1 billion to reopening the
3		Alliance for Prosperity. The results from the first year will
4		determine contribution in future years.
5	SECTION 2.	The Alliance for Prosperity is a program that gives financial
6		assistance to Central America's Northern Triangle (consisting of
7		Guatemala, Honduras, and El Salvador) while requiring that each
8		country pledges their own domestic resources. The alliance focuses
9		on improving well-being through job creation, food programs,
10		stopping crime, reducing corruption, and more, with the underlying
11		goal of reducing immigration to the US.
12	SECTION 3.	The United States Office of Foreign Assistance will enforce this
13		legislation.
14	SECTION 4.	This legislation will take effect immediately upon passage.
15		All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null
16		and void.

A Resolution to Free Puerto Rico from Colonial Rule

1	WHEREAS,	Puerto Rico is a United States territory, entirely denied political
2		representation in the Federal government;
3	WHEREAS,	One-sided exploitative policies such as the Jones Act have been
4		used to extract economic value from the Puerto Rican people,
5		stifling prosperity and financial stability; and
5	WHEREAS,	The United States has a history of suppressing independence
7		movements throughout the 20th century, including by banning
8		independence parties and opposition to federal mandates; and
9	WHEREAS,	Statehood and the accompanying political representation is
10		insufficient to change the systematic exploitative and illiberal
11		policies enforced by the U.S. Federal Government; now, therefore
12		be it
13	RESOLVED,	By the Congress here assembled that the United States shall
14		dissolve Puerto Rico's status as a territory and grant it
15		independence from the United States.
