

Round 1 Item 1

A Bill to Abolish U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE) to Prevent Domestic Human Rights Violations

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

1	SECTION 1.	The United States shall hereby abolish the U.S. Immigration and Customs			
2		Enforcement (ICE) and all funding delegated to the agency will instead be			
3		granted toward the processing of citizenship requests.			
4	SECTION 2.	"Abolish" shall be defined as the ending of all previously established duties			
5		of an organization, the termination of all employment, and the repeal of			
6		the Immigration and Customs Enforcement Authorization Act of 2017.			
7	SECTION 3.	The Department of Homeland Security shall oversee the implementation of			
8		this legislation.			
9		A. Funding previously granted to ICE shall be rerouted to the United			
10		States Citizenship 10 and Immigration Services.			
11		B. The Office of the Principal Legal Advisor shall have its duties delegated			
12		to the 12 Department of Justice.			
13	SECTION 4.	This legislation will take effect 180 days after its enactment. All laws in			
14		conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

Round 1 Item 2

A Bill to admit Puerto Rico as the 51st U.S. State

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:


1	SECTION 1.	Puerto Rico shall be admitted into the United States as a state and be on			
2		equal footing with other states in all respects			
3	SECTION 2.	The State of Puerto Rico shall consist of all islands and territorial waters			
4		presently under the jurisdiction of the territory of Puerto Rico.			
5	SECTION 3.	The Federal Election Commission (FEC) and Congress shall oversee			
6		implementation of this legislation.			
7		A. The FEC shall allocate 2 Senate seats and 3 Electors to Puerto Rico.			
8		Additionally, Puerto Rico's current non-voting delegate(s) in the House			
9		of Representatives shall be given voting status.			
10		B. Congress shall approve the state constitution proposed by the			
		Legislature of Puerto Rico and delegate all other matters of			
11		implementation to the appropriate government agency.			
12	SECTION 4.	This legislation shall immediately go into effect. All laws in conflict with this			
13	SECTION 4.	, ,			
14		legislation are hereby declared null and void.

Round 1 Item 3

The Curbing Hegemony and Infringement Near Asia (C.H.I.N.A) Act

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

1	SECTION 1.	The following measures shall be taken to mitigate conflict in the Asia-Pacific			
2		region.			
3		A. The United States shall negotiate treaties with the Republic of Korea and			
4		Japan that allow for the hosting of US nuclear weapons in each countries'			
5		respective territories. All nuclear weapons shared with these countries			
6		shall remain fully integrated within the US nuclear command chain. B. The United States Navy shall initiate the forward deployment of a carrier			
7		strike group to the Subic Bay Naval Base.			
8		C. The Department of State shall negotiate military base sharing and building			
9		agreements with the Philippines, Vietnam, Palau and Micronesia.			
10	SECTION 2.				
11		A. A carrier strike group shall be defined as consisting of one aircraft carrier and			
12		any other ships or aircraft the US Navy deems necessary for carrier operations.			
13		B. Military base sharing and building agreements shall be defined as treaties			
14		allowing the US military to build and/or operate military bases on foreign soil.			
15	SECTION 3.	The Department of Defense shall be responsible for the implementation of this			
16		legislation. Any additional funding needed by the Department of Defense for			
17		implementation shall be provided through supplemental appropriations.			
18	SECTION 4.	This legislation will come into effect immediately upon passage. All laws in conflict			
19		with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.			



Round 2 Item 1

A Bill to Incorporate AI into the Military

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

1	SECTION 1.	A total of \$25 billion will be allocated to incorporate fully autonomous			
2		artificial intelligence into United States military operations.			
3		A. \$20 billion is allocated to develop a fully autonomous AI that will			
4		operate combat drones.			
5		B. \$5 billion is allocated to develop a fully autonomous AI system that			
6		will collect, process, and analyze data used by the United States military.			
7	SECTION 2.	Artificial intelligence (AI) is a machine-based computer system that can			
8		replicate a range of human functions and continually get better at their			
9		assigned tasks. Fully autonomous AI is capable of completing assigned			
10		tasks without any human input or intervention. Data is any information			
11		collected during military intelligence and surveillance operations.			
12	SECTION 3.	The United States Department of Defense (DoD) shall be tasked with			
13		implementing this legislation. The DoD budget will be increased by \$25			
14		billion.			
15	SECTION 4.	This legislation will take effect January 1, 2026. All laws in conflict with this			
16		legislation are hereby declared null and void.			

Round 2 Item 2

A Bill to Require Background Checks to Purchase Firearms

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

1	SECTION 1.	All persons will be required by law to pass a background check to purchase a		
2		firearm. All types of firearms, including but not limited to shotguns, handguns,		
3		and rifles, will be included in this bill.		
4	SECTION 2.	The requirements to pass this background check will include but are not limited		
5		to:		
6		A. U.S. citizenship		
7		B. The legal age to purchase a firearm		
8		C. No criminal record involving violence		
9		 A crime involving violence is defined as any form of assault, rape, murder (with the exception of manslaughter) or arson. 		
10		D. Not currently diagnosed with any serious mental illness or personality		
11		disorder.		
12		a. A serious mental illness is defined as a mental illness that		
13		interferes with a person's life and ability to function.		
		b. A personality disorder is defined as a mental health condition		
14		that involves long-lasting, all-encompassing, disruptive patterns of		
15		thinking, behavior, mood and relating to others.		
16	SECTION 3.	The Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives (ATF) will oversee the		
17		implementation of this legislation.		
18		A. All current laws put in place by the ATF regarding firearms will remain in effect		
19		unless the laws directly interfere with the implementation of this bill.		
20		B. The ATF will implement an extra tax of \$50 per firearm purchased to help		
21		cover the costs of the background checks		
	SECTION 4.	14. This legislation will go into effect January 1, 2026. All laws in conflict with this		
22		legislation are hereby declared null and void.		

Round 2 Item 3

A Resolution to Amend the Constitution to Establish Supreme Court Term Limits

1	RESOLVED,	By two-thirds of the Congress here assembled, that the following article is		
2		proposed as a	an amendment to the Constitution of the United States, which	
3		shall be valid to all intents and purposes as part of the Constitution when		
4		ratified by the legislatures of three-fourths of the several states within		
5		seven years f	rom the date of its submission by the Congress:	
6			ARTICLE 6	
7		SECTION 1:	All Supreme Court justices shall serve one 18-year term.	
8			Justices are not permitted to be appointed for a second	
9			term.	
10		SECTION 2:		
11			The Congress shall have power to enforce this article by	
12			appropriate legislation.
