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A Bill to Implement Desalination Plants in the U.S.

1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:

2.	SECTION 1.	The U.S Federal Government shall hereby invest in desalination plants in coastal cities.		
3.	SECTION 2.	A. Desalination plants shall be defined as industrial facilities that use chemical or		
4.		physical processes to reduce or recover salt concentrations from water supplies.		
5.		B. Coastal cities shall be defined as cities located on the interface or transition areas		
6.		between land and sea, including large inland lakes with access to saltwater.		
7.	SECTION 3.	The Department of Interior (DOI) will be given 20 billion dollars to be allotted to private		
8.		and state entities for the creation of desalination plants. The Bureau of Reclamation will		
9.		be tasked with investing an additional 20 million dollars into research and development		
10.		through grants.		
11.	SECTION 4.	This legislation shall go into effect the following Fiscal Year after passage.		
12.	SECTION 5.	All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

5.		suspic	ion is detected again then the person will be blacklisted.	
6.	SECTION 3.	The m	inimum age to get a license is 16, any people younger than 16 may only babysit	
7.		family	members.	
8.	SECTION 4.	A licer	nse is only needed to babysit children who are not related to the babysitter.	
9.	SECTION 5.	The se	cond chance will only be given to individuals who have had only minor offenses in	
10.		the pa	est, this will be determined by a court trial, any federal or alarming offenses will	
11.		make	it so they can not receive the second chance and therefore the license.	
12.	SECTION 6.	There	will be a new program introduced where they will undergo teachings and	
13.		examp	ples and once the program is complete they will take an exam, if passed then they	
14.		will be	e granted a license.	
15.	SECTION 7.	Things that may be classified as suspicious include recent criminal activity, any recent		
16.		police	reports, or any documented harm or intended harm to children.	
17.	SECTION 8.	The US General Service Admission shall oversee the implementation of this bill.

19.			babysitters every 2 years to ensure they are still fit to care for children, making	
20.			them take a similar exam to the one that got them their license.

A Bill to Remove The Penny From US Currency Circulation

- 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:
- SECTION 1. The one-cent coin, known as the penny, shall be removed from the United States
 currency circulation and not replaced with another coin of the same value.
- SECTION 2. The United States Mint will be directed to stop its production of the penny and not
 replace it with a denomination of equal value.
- 6. **SECTION 4.** This legislation shall go into effect the following Fiscal Year after passage.
- 7. **SECTION 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Bill to Regulate Technology

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- SECTION 1. The Federal Government shall now have the power to regulate advanced electronic
 technology.
- SECTION 2. Advanced electronic technology will be defined as any system using Artificial Intelligence
 as its main function such as self driving cars, autonomous programs and AI chat
 programs

7. SECTION 3. This congress will also oversee the creation of the Department of Technology which will
8. oversee the structure of the organization and enforcement of this bill.

- 9. A. This Department will work on placing regulations on all new and past advanced10. electronic technology.
- 11.B.Any business that goes against the regulation attempts will face a fine of \$50,00012.for each attempt.
- 13. C. Regulation will be defined as rules and guidelines that will be created by the14. Department of Technology as they see fit.
- 15. D. Funds for this piece of legislation will come from a 2% tax on advanced electronic
 16. technology companies.
- 17. SECTION 4. This bill will go into effect in the next fiscal year.
- 18. **SECTION 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Bill to Establish Supreme Court Justice Term Limits

- 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:
- SECTION 1. There shall be an 18-year term limit applied to any individual serving on the Supreme
 Court.
- A. The 18-year term for current justices will start upon the legislation's effect
 date. All future justices will have their 18 year-terms beginning upon being
 confirmed by the Senate.
- SECTION 2. A term limit will be defined as the amount of time an individual can execute the duties
 of a government office legally.
- SECTION 3. The Department of Justice shall enforce this bill along with the Senate and House
 Judiciary Committees.
- 11. **SECTION 4.** This legislation shall take effect in the 2026 Fiscal Year starting on October 1st.
- 12. **SECTION 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Bill to End All Legacy and Donor Admissions for Private and Public Colleges and Universities

- 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:
- SECTION 1. All preferential admission treatments based on all or singly as followed, Donors, and or
 Legacy Admissions shall end.
- 4. **SECTION 2.** Donors are individuals or corporations with ties to prospective students who donate
- 5. money, and or equipment/material to Colleges and Universities. Legacy shall be defined
- 6. as any prospective student who is related by blood or marriage to any immediate family
- 7. members going back at least two generations who had attended that institution in any
- 8. capacity. Colleges and Universities shall include all two and four year schools, as well as
 9. those offering advanced degrees
- 10. **SECTION 3.** The department of Education shall oversee all implementation and policing.
- 11. **SECTION 4.** The Department of Education shall implement this law no later than July of 2025.
- 12. **SECTION 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

4.		chance	of winning money, valuable items, virtual currency, or other incentives, including:	
5.		A.	Games based on chance: Activities where the outcome of a financial risk scenario	
6.			is determined solely by chance.	
7.		В.	Loot boxes: Virtual items in video games that can be purchased for a chance at	
8.			being more competitive, appealing, or powerful.	
9.	SECTION 3.	The Federal Trade Commission and individual state gambling regulatory agencies shall		
10.		jointly	oversee the implementation and enforcement of this legislation.	
11.		Α.	Individual state gambling regulators will be responsible for investigating and	
12.			reporting instances of online gambling corporations within their State to the	
13.			Federal Trade Commission.	
14.		В.	The Federal Trade Commission will be responsible for terminating any online	
15.			gambling apparatus, alongside issuing a \$10,000 fine to online gambling	
16.			operations for non-compliance.

A Bill to Limit Vehicle Hood Height

- 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:
- SECTION 1. All vehicles sold in the United States of America Shall have a hood height of 40 inches or
 less.
- SECTION 2. Hood height shall be determined by measuring the distance from the ground to the
 leading edge of the hood.
- SECTION 3. The United States Department of Transportation shall oversee the mandatory
 production regulations and ensure all vehicles sold in the United States meet the new
 hood height requirement of 40 inches.
- 9. **SECTION 4.** This bill shall take effect July 1, 2028.
- 10. **SECTION 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

A Bill To Adopt a 'No-First-Use' Nuclear Policy

- 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:
- 2. SECTION 1. The United States of America will adopt a global No-First-Use (NFU) nuclear policy.
- 3. **SECTION 2.** An NFU nuclear policy will restrict when a president could consider using nuclear
- 4. weapons and will help signal that the United States believes that nuclear weapons are
 5. for deterrence—not warfighting.
- SECTION 3. This nuclear no-first-use policy will be declared publicly and multilaterally by the United
 States and its allies.
- 8. SECTION 4. This bill shall take effect January 20, 2025.
- 9. **SECTION 5.** All laws in conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.
