6	SECTION 2	Urgent care is A care need that isn't an emergency but requires
7		prompt medical attention, usually within 24 to 48 hours (Kaiser
8		Permanente organization)
9	SECTION 3	This legislation will be overseen and enforced by The Florida
10		Department of Corrections.
11	SECTION 4	This legislation will take effect on January 1, 2026. All laws in conflict
12		with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

## A Bill to Mandate Voter Participation to Increase National Voter Turnout

1	BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:	
2	SECTION 1	All eligible U.S. citizens are required to participate in federal, state,
3		and local elections by casting a vote in each election.
4	SECTION 2	A. "Eligible U.S. citizens" shall be defined as citizens 18 years or older,
5		excluding those legally disenfranchised by a court of law.
6		B. "Participate" shall be defined as submitting a vote, whether by
7		mail, in-person, or electronically if available.
8		The US Department of State in conjunction with USAID will be
9	SECTION 3	responsible for the implementation and oversight of this bill.
10		A. A fine of \$50 will be imposed on citizens who fail to vote without
11		legitimate reason (e.g. Medical exemption, military service).
12		B. Citizens may appeal penalties through a waiver application citing
13		hardship or religious reasons.
14	SECTION 4	This legislation will take effect on FY 2025. All laws in conflict with this
15		legislation are hereby declared null and void.

# A Bill to Expand Nuclear Energy Development to Reduce Carbon Emissions

1	BE IT ENACT	ED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:
2	SECTION 1	The federal government shall invest \$50 billion in nuclear energy
3		development, including research, reactor construction, and
4		infrastructure improvements by 2035.
5	SECTION 2	"Nuclear energy development" refers to the expansion of fission and
6		fusion technology to provide cleaner and more efficient energy
7		alternatives.
8	SECTION 3	The Department of Energy shall oversee enforcement by issuing
9		grants, fast-tracking regulatory approval for compliant projects,
10		and monitoring safety compliance. Violations of safety protocols
11		may result in project shutdowns and funding revocation.
12	SECTION 4	This legislation will take effect in FY 2027. All laws in conflict with this
13		leaislation are hereby declared null and void.



#### A Bill to Reduce the Age for Loans

1	BE IT ENACT	ED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:
2	SECTION 1	Child entrepreneurship has a very positive impact on a community's
3		economy. However, many child entrepreneurs need boosts to start
4		off their business. To account for this, the minimum age for owning
5		credit cards and taking out loans will be reduced to 16 years of age
6		for Junior Entrepreneurs.
7	SECTION 2	"Junior Entrepreneurs" are starters or owners of companies below
8		the age of 22 with parental support. Business/companies refers to
9		the practice of making one's living by engaging in commerce.
10		"Parent co-signer" - in the case specifically refers either
11		parent/legal guardian only who guarantee to pay back the loan if
12		the Junior Entrepreneur defaults on or (fails to pay back the loan).
13	SECTION 3	The U.S. Department of Commerce shall be responsible for the
14		oversight and enforcement of this law.
15		A. The minimum age for owning credit cards and taking out loans
16		will be reduced to 16 years of age.
17		B. All loans applied for by entrepreneurs will require the inclusion of a
18		parent /guardian co-signer.
19		C. The bank that provides the loan will have the right to repossess
20		any and all items bought directly with the use of the loan if the
21		terms of the loan are not met.
22		D. If debts are still not paid after repossession, money will be drawn
23		from the Parent /guardian co-sigher's account.
24	SECTION 4	This legislation will take effect upon ratification of this bill. All laws in
25		conflict with this legislation are hereby declared null and void.

#### A Bill to Ban Single Use Plastics Nationwide

1	BE IT ENACT	ED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:
2	SECTION 1	This bill will instill a nationwide ban on the production and use of all
3		single-use, non-degradable plastics. It will be directed towards
4		major plastic producing facilities across the U.S.
5	SECTION 2	A "single-use, non-degradable plastics" are plastics that cannot be
6		recycled or reused and cannot be broken down efficiently without
7		the use of machinery or other artificial means.
8	SECTION 3	The U.S Environmental Protection Agency will be in charge of
9		enforcing this bill. Failure to comply with this bill will result in fines
10		and continued resistance will result in forceful shut down of the
11		operation. (1) Fines imposed will be directly correlated to the
12		amount of non-degradable plastic produced, used, and/or sold by
13		the facility after passing. (2) The import and export of
14		non-degradable plastics in the U.S will now be considered
15		smuggling. (3) This bill should in no way have an influence on
16		actions outside of the U.S.
17	SECTION 4	All plastic producing facilities will immediately be informed of this
18		ban and given time to ease into the new rule. Punishments will
19		become more harsh over the course of 364 days after passing in
20		which failure to cooperate will then result in large fines and shut
21		down.

#### A Bill to Improve the Amount of Affordable Housing Development and Access Act

1	BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:	
2	SECTION 1	This bill is intended to improve the amount of affordable houses in
3		the United States through improved federal funding of state and
4		local projects.
5	SECTION 2	Housing: is when a house is provided from the government to
6		someone who isn't able to buy it themselves. Affordable: reasonable
7		price on something. Funding: money provided, especially by an
8		organization or government, for a particular purpose. Homelessness:
9		when someone is without a home, money, or basic necessities.
10	SECTION 3	This bill will be enforced by the U.S. Department of Housing and
11		Urban Development and be funded through the A. loans to
12		qualifying county and state housing companies. B. Loans to
13		qualifying first time home buyers C. The funding for this bill will come
14		from the budget allotted to the Fair Housing Program.
15	SECTION 4	At the time of the passing of this bill, its terms will be enforced
16		immediately and all laws counteracting this will be null and void.

#### A Bill to Regulate Social Media Platforms to Protect Free Speech and Prevent Misinformation

1	BE IT ENACT	ED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:
2	SECTION 1	Social media platforms shall be required to publicly disclose their
3		content moderation policies, algorithms, and appeal processes
4		while ensuring they do not suppress constitutionally protected
5		speech.
6	SECTION 2	"Social media platforms" are defined as online services with over 10
7		million active monthly users that allow public content sharing and
8		interaction.
9	SECTION 3	The Federal Communications Commission (FCC) and the Federal
10		Trade Commission (FTC) shall oversee enforcement. Platforms that
11		fail to comply will be subject to fines up to \$50 million per violation.
12	SECTION 4	This legislation will take effect on July 1, 2026. All laws in conflict with
13		this legislation are hereby declared null and void.



# A Bill to Continue U.S. Military and Humanitarian Aid to Ukraine

1	BE IT ENACT	ED BY THE CONGRESS HERE ASSEMBLED THAT:
2	SECTION 1	The United States shall provide \$60 billion in military and
3		humanitarian aid to Ukraine to support its defense and
4		reconstruction efforts.
5	SECTION 2	Aid shall be allocated as follows: 60% for military defense and
6		equipment, 30% for humanitarian relief, and 10% for cybersecurity
7		and counter-disinformation efforts.
8	SECTION 3	The Department of Defense and USAID shall oversee enforcement.
9		Funds will be distributed through direct aid packages and
10		monitored for proper use. Any misuse of funds may result in aid
11		suspension.
12	SECTION 4	This legislation will take effect in FY 2026. All laws in conflict with this
13		legislation are hereby declared null and void.
